

Important Information

1. To accurately find your cat's weight, firstly weigh yourself, then weigh yourself holding your cat. Your cat's weight is your weight subtracted from the combined weight.
2. To minimise re-infestation of your cat with intestinal worms, treat all cats and dogs in the household at the same time.
3. Cats are frequently infested by fleas, which are the intermediate hosts (carriers) of tapeworm (*Dipylidium caninum*). To provide complete protection for your cat an integrated flea control programme should also be implemented.
4. Always maintain a high standard of hygiene when disposing of your cat's droppings.

EXELPET Intestinal All-Wormer for Cats may be combined with other treatments such as flea treatments.

EXELPET® Intestinal All-Wormer for Cats is recommended for the control of gastrointestinal worms in cats and kittens. The tablets, when administered as directed, will control:


Roundworm: (*Toxocara cati*, *Toxascaris leonina*);
Hookworm: (*Ancylostoma tubaeforme*, *Ancylostoma braziliense*, *Uncinaria stenocephala*);
Tapeworm: (*Dipylidium caninum*, *Taenia taeniaeformis*).

DIRECTIONS FOR USE:
Dosage and Administration
EXELPET Intestinal All-Wormer for Cats is given as a single dose by mouth. Cats should be dosed on an empty stomach, see dosing tips below.
IT IS ESSENTIAL TO WEIGH YOUR CAT BEFORE TREATMENT.

| Bodyweight | Tablets |
|-----------------|------------------|
| 2.5kg AND UNDER | ½ |
| 2.6 – 5.0kg | 1 |
| Over 5kg | 1 tablet per 5kg |

Worms are usually found in the faeces after treatment, however worms may not appear for up to 48 hours after treatment. If worm problems persist consult a veterinarian.


Dispose of empty container by wrapping in paper and putting in garbage.
Store below 30°C (Room Temperature) in a dry place.

Dosing Tips

- Grip the cat's muzzle from behind the head with the thumb and index fingers in corners of the mouth behind the eye teeth.
- Push the jaws open by squeezing your thumb and index fingers together tilting the head back. Alternatively, grip the cat tightly by the loose skin at the back of the neck. Arch the head back this helps open your cat's mouth without hurting it.
- Place the tablet on the back of the tongue, pushing the tablet right over the back of the tongue with the tip of your little finger (all of this should be done as quickly as possible).
- Close the mouth and stroke the throat until the tablet is swallowed.

Treatment Frequency
 Cats can be re-infested with worms from other pets or from their surroundings, therefore treatment should be repeated regularly. Follow the treatment frequency recommendations in the table below and worm all your pets at the same time to maximise protection:

| Kittens up to 12 Weeks of Age | Kittens & Cats From 12 Weeks of Age | Pregnant Cats |
|---|--|--|
| Treat at 6, 8 and 12 weeks of age for: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Roundworm • Hookworm | Treat every 3 months For: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Roundworm • Hookworm • Tapeworm | Treat at mating, before birth of kittens and then every 3 months |

If worm problems persist, consult a veterinarian.
